First of all, Assi.Prof.Tann Ngy, UHS' SafeMa project manager, delivered welcome remarks to all partners in the SafeMa project and followed by remarks from Prof. Emmanouil Pikoulis, NKUA's coordinator of SafeMa project. WP3 Curriculum Delivery, network building and research communities

Representative of HMU, NDUN and TNU presented a short summary of what has been achieved:

- Provided the internship for modules (2 months) at obstetric & gynecological hospital guide by faculty member and instructors working in the hospital.
- Exam and certification: Students finished the first 4 modules then took the exam by online, finally 46 students got certificates.
- In the module 5-8: 46 students joined but not all students finished in all modules



- Status of the Safe-Ma network of excellence: NDUN had an opportunity to present the safe-Ma course for Vietnam Midwifery association in annual meeting in September 2021 and connected to the hospital and midwifery association to describe the safe-Ma course curriculum.

Representative of IU presented a short summary of what has been achieved:

- IU had 46 participants (module 1-4), online and in-class course, 6 months, 4 months of theory and 2 months of internship and provided certificate (4 modules).
- 65 participants (module 5-8) duration and activities like module 1-4, 4 months of theory & 2 months and provide certificate as Postgraduate diploma (8 modules participation).

Representative of UHS presented a short summary of what has been achieved:

- Module 1-4 had 42 participants, and the course provided intensive 8h/day. Class delivered via online for theory and in-class for simulation in a period of 6 weeks (5 weeks of theory and 1 week of internship). Student will be provided certificate of completion of 4 modules.
- Module 5-8 had 41 participants, and the course provided intensive 8h/day. Class delivered via online for theory and in-class for simulation in a period of 6 weeks (5 weeks of theory and 1 week of internship). Student will be provided certificate of completion of 8 modules.

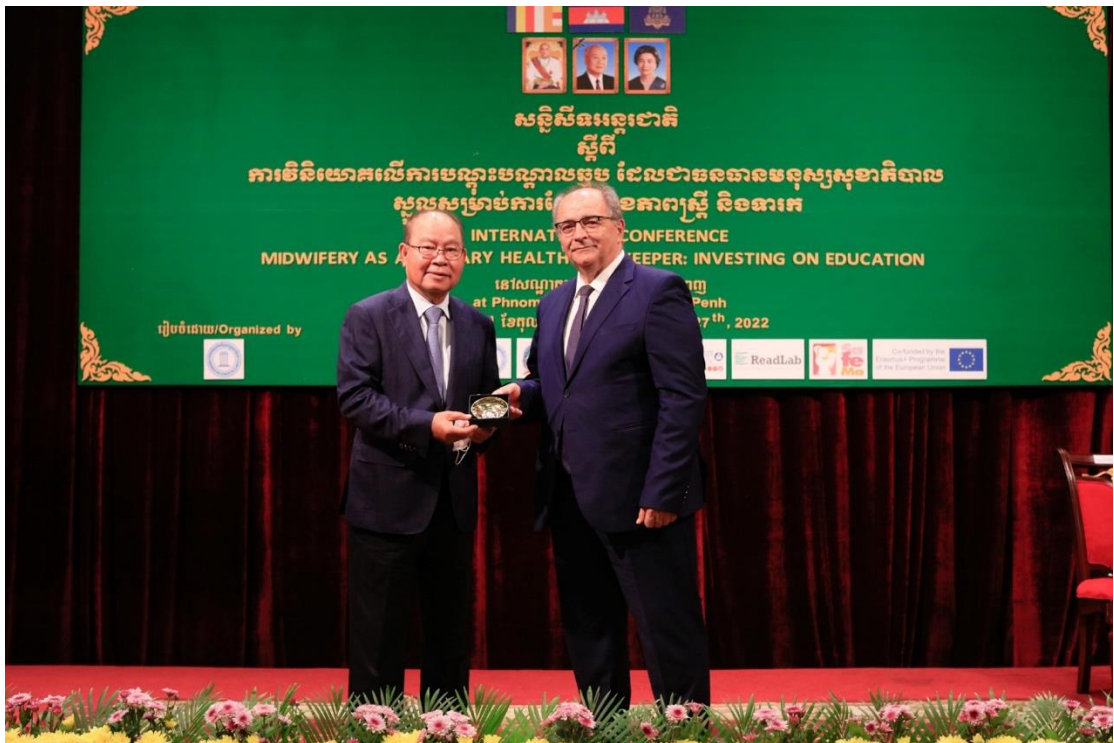
Closing Ceremony
